

**Risk Benefit Assessment for Glassware to be used****Benefit of Experience:**

1. Greater choice in size of drink for families
2. Cleaner than plastic when dish washed as can air dry reducing bacteria build up
3. Preferable experience drinking from glass than plastic cup

Cups taken out by children	Breaking in playground / building and creating cuts	M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Glass cups only to be used at quiet periods (EG term time, not holiday sessions)</li> <li>• Cardboard cups offered as alternative.</li> <li>• If children are taking drinks into the play space, cardboard cups are provided instead.</li> <li>• Cardboard cups used in busy holiday sessions.</li> <li>• Dustpan and brush stored in cupboard under sink to sweep up any breakages immediately.</li> </ul>	L	Playworker
